### Art & Design GRAPHIC DESIGN (Fall 2018 & Later)

The Graphic Designer learns to communicate visually through concentrated studies in graphic design theory, skills, and practice. This is a conceptually based visual communications program which focuses on developing the thought processes which lead to successful solutions to design challenges. The challenges explored in Graphic design include those that impact the public with images and messages from companies institutions, projects, movements, and individuals that are effectively solved by graphic designers. The concentration in graphic design requires the completion of 51 credit hours in Art & Design plus an additional 69 credits in the General Education area required of all BA degrees for a total of 120 credits. All Art & Design majors are required to complete a Foundation Art Core of 24 credits, plus 27 additional advanced credits in Graphic Design. Field trips to design studios, printers, and pre-press offices are a regular part of the program, as are guest speakers, critics, an annual art festival, and trips to New York City galleries and museums. Internships for class credit are also available with local studios and in-house design departments.
