Bachelor of Science in Management (Fall 2023)

The Management major is a broad-based degree program enabling students to understand how organizations operate in the contemporary global environment. Drawing on management theory as well as current business practices, students develop knowledge, skills and competencies that will enable them to assure positions in a wide variety of industries and organizations.

In addition to coursework in business disciplines such as accounting, economics, finance, law, marketing, management information systems and operations management, students complete management courses that explore how resources- whether human, information, technology, knowledge or materials-all strategically combine to achieve the goals of an organization. Communication, teamwork and leadership skills needed in managerial roles are emphasized across the curriculum. Students may also choose a 4 course minor in Global Business Management, Small Business Management and Human Resource Management or take 3 additional Management Elective courses. All management students must complete an internship.
