Throughout human history, religion has played an enormous role in the shaping human actions and perceptions, as well as social institutions and values. The academic study of religion involves a sympathetic yet critical examination of the human attempt to answer the questions, "Who are we and why are we here?" It also allows us to understand better the complex world in which we live. The study of Theology and Religious Studies at Sacred Heart University therefore uses the methods of several disciplines that facilitate understanding of self, society, and ultimate reality.

The Theology and Religious Studies program explores the vital theological traditions of Catholicism. It helps students gain a deeper understanding of the human quest for transcendence and it provides models for the appropriation of faith into modern life. The program further explores the rich traditions of the world's religions. It helps students understand the role of religion in the development of the world's cultures, and to appreciate and analyze its complex role in the contemporary world.

Graduating majors enter all fields of work, since understanding of religious and cultural diversity is increasingly valuable. Some careers to which the major is particularly tailored are religious education, higher education, campus ministry, medical ethics, public policy, and philanthropic and nonprofit work.
