The major in English is concerned with the study of literature and with oral and written communication. It is characterized by an emphasis on providing a strong foundation in literature and its related disciplines. Literature, writing, oral communication, and theater studies are areas in which students may choose to concentrate their work. A 14: 1 student-faculty ratio and personal attention insure that all majors graduate with the strengths necessary to pursue their chosen careers. Graduates with an English major often pursue careers in business, in publishing, in education, in the theater, in broadcasting, in public relations and advertising, in journalism, and in the legal profession. In addition, many graduates proceed to advanced study in English or Rhetoric.
