The Baccalaureate Social Work Program at Sacred Heart University is fully accredited by the Council on Social Work Education and maintains a commitment to educate undergraduate students for competent, ethical, and professional entry-level generalist social work practice. The bachelor's level social work program is the equivalent of the first year of a master's degree in social work program. Students who meet the requirements of their graduate school of interest may apply for Advanced Standing and complete the advanced year of the MSW program only.

Students may declare their major at any time, but a formal application to the program must be submitted in the Spring semester of the sophomore year. Major declarations will not be permitted during the registration period. Students must maintain a 2.6 cumulative GPA, a 2.6 GPA in the major courses, and a C+ or better in all major and supporting courses. Students must achieve the required level of academic and professional competency each semester of field placement to continue in the program.
